Winter Lawn Care?

Many of us wait for it and it is finally here, the lawn mower was put away a while ago and you have been relaxing for a couple months, but not so fast if you want a healthy lawn in the spring. It is extremely important not to leave debris, leaves, or toys out on the lawn. These things can smother the grass, create disease conditions, and invite insects, mice and other damaging pests. Winter is also the best time to prune trees and roses. If you prune before they bud, it encourages new growth and it is the perfect time to dress up the area around the trunk. You should have a mulch ring at least three feet in diameter (depending on tree size) around the base of the tree. And finally it is the perfect time to prepare your mower for the next season. When was the last time you changed the oil, cleaned the intake filter and sharpened the blade? A well maintained lawn mower cuts grass cleaner which helps prevent common lawn diseases, promotes growth and just downright looks better.

BURNING

State law requires that you notify the Forestry Commission prior to burning outdoors. In most cases, the law applies to burning leaves, limbs and branches that you clean up from your yard. The notification law does not apply within town or city limits.

The toll-free numbers below allow you a quick, easy way to make your yard debris burning notification. Just dial the appropriate number, listen to the message, and leave your name, address and phone number.

The law requires that you clear a firebreak around the burning site and have the right equipment available to keep the fire under control. You must also stay with the fire until it is completely safe.

Dorchester County toll free number is 1-800-986-3746

After a permit number is obtained from the Forestry Department, the information must be provided to the Ashley River Fire Department.

ARB APPROVAL FIRST

Homeowners in all subdivisions **MUST** have Architectural Review Board (**ARB**) approval for **ANY** change to their property. If you make improvement without first getting **ARB** approval, you will be in jeopardy of having to redo or remove the project. The most common requests are for satellite dishes, fences, paint color, landscaping changes and construction projects including roofs, windows and doors. The preferred placement for a satellite dish is at the rear of the house and not visible from the street. Dish placement requires **ARB** approval.
